The Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council (SAC) is a 21-member body that brings together community members and representatives from various government agencies to advise the Sanctuary Superintendent and the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration. The Sanctuary's mission is to provide long term protection to its nationally significant marine resources, while facilitating compatible human uses. We write to express support for a group project being submitted for consideration by Bren School students Ms. Kiya Gornik and Mr. Brandon Doheny.

The SAC played an integral role in the development and establishment of the network of Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) within the waters of the Sanctuary. Recognizing the need to adaptively manage the marine reserve network the SAC (and others) participated in a process to identify key priority socio-economic research and monitoring needs. These recommendations were formalized in the Sanctuary Social Science Plan<sup>1</sup> (SSP). In addition, ever since the reserves were designated the SAC has identified socio-economic monitoring as an important issue.

Partnering with the Sanctuary and the Environmental Defense Center, Ms. Gornik and Mr. Doheny are proposing to study a research priority identified in the SSP, specifically addressing the group of users who access the Sanctuary for recreation on private boats. The group project would utilize existing data<sup>2</sup> to develop a socioeconomic model that will analyze how private recreational boat users value the Sanctuary. As a key stakeholder in developing the SSP, the SAC views this project as an extension of our past efforts. We support this collaborative research project because it utilizes existing data, fulfills an identified research and data gap, contributes to the Sanctuary missions, and advances adaptive management of Sanctuary MPAs. We look forward to working with the Bren students and their colleagues on this project.
